# Welcome Back!!



As we embark upon the 2018-19 school year, student and staff safety and personal well-being remain the top priority at North Bend Central Public Schools. This school year, NBC has two new endeavors that will enhance the educational journey for students. The first addition is a school resource officer. The Dodge County Sheriff's Office initiated a partnership between North Bend Central, Logan View, and Dodge County to contract a half-time school resource officer at both school districts during the school year. This officer will spend equitable time in both districts throughout the school year and work exclusively for Dodge County in the summer months. The individual selected to serve as our school resource officer will be an active deputy currently on staff with the Dodge County Sheriff's Office. The Dodge County Sheriff's Office will continue to employ the school resource officer while providing and overseeing the specialized training necessary for that individual to successfully serve in this capacity. Through this partnership, the full-time deputy will be contracted with the two school districts during the school year. North Bend Central and Logan View will equally share the cost, time, and the services provided by the school resource officer. This program will be reviewed, evaluated, and considered for renewal on an annual basis.

Another addition to the NBC Team will be the full-time position of a school psychologist. The district contracted for part-time school psychologist services in the past. By transitioning to a full-time staff member with their undivided attention to NBC, the school psychologist will serve as an outreach to youth with internalizing problems and provide long term, consistent, personalized services. The contemporary school psychologist is a resource to students that promotes mental health through individual and group consultation in a safe environment. With personal mental health issues minimized, students will experience better attendance, less time lost from school work, and theoretically, a better school environment for educational outcomes.

The district hired Mrs. Robin Schweitzer for this position. Mrs. Schweitzer worked successfully as a school psychologist in Iowa and North Platte previously and will have an office in the renovated office space at the elementary school. School districts earn a reputation for their ability to develop young people into successful adults. As our world becomes increasingly volatile, the addition of the school resource officer program and full-time school psychologist position will minimize outside issues so our excellent teaching staff can focus on academic attainment for each and every student in the classroom. ### **Exciting News for Middle School!**



NBC is going 1:1!! All students attending NBC Middle School and High School will receive a laptop device this school year. Students in 6th and 7th grade will check-out devices on Aug. 9th and 8th-12th graders will check-out devices on August 14th from 5pm-8pm. During the first week of school, students will go through a series of mini-courses on Canvas, ethics, digital citizenship, and programs such as google suites.

In relationship with the 1:1 initiative students are encouraged to have their own set of earbuds to use during school hours. Big headphones are discouraged and they do not fit in the laptop sleeves. Students are not allowed to wear the earbuds throughout the school day.

### **ATTENTION PARENTS ---- Karen Haase Coming to NBC!!**

Karen Haase is from KBS Law practices in the area of educational law. Mrs. Haase will present at NBC on August 14th at 6:00 p.m. in the Old Gymnasium. Mrs. Haase will address cyberbullying, sexting, and internet safety to parents and students. You will not be disappointed as Karen uses humor, statistics, and summaries of real-life cases and consequences as she dives into social media.

**Parents & students are required to attend in person or view the presentation on-line as part of the 1:1 roll-out program.**

### **Dress Code Reminders**

The purpose of a dress code is to provide guidance to students and parents as to appropriate attire for school. In addition, the dress code is a primary means of helping students learn a skill, which is required for success in getting and keeping employment linked to attire. A few reminders as you finish your back to school clothes shopping. Shorts and skirts must be of modest length and extend to approximately mid-thigh. Undergarments or pockets may not be visible in shorts/skirts. Halter tops and spaghetti straps are prohibited, shirts that sit off the shoulders may be permitted granted a tank top with a one inch sleeve is worn under the blouse/shirt.

### **High School Courses for College Credit/Articulated Courses**

This year NBC will be offering four high school courses that students can also take for college credit. NBC has partnered with Peru State College to offer this opportunity for students to obtain dual credit. Students must pay the Peru tuition and fees and upon completion of the course(s) they will receive both NBC High School credit and Peru State College credit. The following courses have been approved for dual enrollment credit for the 2018-2019 school:

- Pre-Calculus
- College Biology
- College English (Appreciation of Literature and English Composition)
- College Speech

# It's Elementary!!

**WELCOME BACK TIGERS!** Learning is an adventure and I am excited to begin the 2018-19 journey! You will notice a few changes as you enter the elementary this year. The final touches are being placed on renovations made to the office and nurse's area. We now have a secure entrance to add to the safety of the learning environment for our students. The newly constructed playground is a sight to behold! I'm looking forward to seeing the playground filled with smiling faces and laughter as students take in the sights. We have much to look forward to on our learning journey in 2018-19 and I can't wait to get the year started!



**OPEN HOUSE-** Open House will be held on Monday, August 13th from 6:00pm-7:00pm. The NBCE PTA will be hosting a Playground Open House to provide families an opportunity to connect during Open House and celebrate the new playground. There will be music, t-shirt and paw sign sales from 5:30pm-7:00pm on the playground.

The first day of school for students in K-5 is Tuesday, August 14th with an early dismissal of 1:20pm for bus students and 1:25pm for all other students. The regular school day begins at 8:10am and ends at 3:25pm for elementary students. Students needing breakfast can begin eating at 7:40am and enter through the main door at the front of the school.

**PRESCHOOL** will start on Wednesday, August 15th! The beginning and ending times for preschool are slightly different from our K-5 students to help with traffic flow. The morning preschool session runs from 8:05-11:30am and the afternoon session is from 12:00-3:25pm. Preschool students will be dropped off and picked up at the Northwest door.

**DROP OFF AND PICK UP-** When dropping off students in the morning you can pull into the designated drop off/pick up lane or into one of the parking spaces in front of the building or by the City Park.

At the end of the day, students can be picked up in the designated drop off/pick up lane or parking spaces in front of the building, or on Catalpa or Elm St., in the gravel parking lot to the west of the school, or in the City Park parking areas. Please go over your plans for pick up with your child before the first day of school so they know where to go at the end of the day.

We will start our walking program on the first day of school, with the exception of Kindergarten. Kindergarten students will enter at their regular door on the south side of the building and remain with their teachers. All other students will enter through the main doors at the front of the building.

**PICTURE DAY IS SEPTEMBER 6TH-** Pegasus School Images will be taking our school pictures. Proofs will be sent home a few weeks after pictures are taken and packages can be ordered online or by returning the proofs and order form to the school. More information will be available at Open House.

**WEEKLY NEWSLETTERS-** The office will send out a weekly newsletter on Mondays. The newsletter includes information about upcoming events, important dates, and other helpful information. You can also sign up on the nbtigers home page to have the weekly newsletters emailed to you.

**NBC AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM-** We will again offer an afterschool program at the elementary for the 18-19 school year! The program can enroll up to 45 students and is available on a first come first serve basis at a cost of \$16.50 a week or \$5.50 per day. A sliding scale fee is available for qualifying families. Enrollment forms can be found on the NBC website or they can be picked up from the office. The program will be held Monday-Friday, 3:30-5:00pm during the school year. The program will not be held when school is not in session or on early dismissal days. Please contact the school office with additional questions.

# LUNCH PROGRAM APPLICATION FORMS

Applications for the federal free/reduced price lunch and breakfast program are available in the offices of the North Bend Elementary School and the North Bend Central Jr. Sr. High School. The form will also be available at the open houses held at either of the schools or is available on our website [nbtigers.org](http://nbtigers.org). Under **District**, then select **Forms**, then **Application**. If you qualify for this program, we encourage you to take advantage of it.



The number of children identified as eligible for this program determines the amount of money our schools receive for Title I, state aid, and several other state and federal programs. Even if your child does not eat lunch at school, completing an application form can help generate state and federal funds for instructional programs.

*If you are not now eligible*, you can apply throughout the year for the federal free/reduced price lunch and breakfast program if your income changes. Contact Pam Pabian at the high school if you have questions.

We ask that you get your lunch program application in as soon as possible. **We can only credit new applications from the date of approval and cannot backdate to the start of the school year. Students who were not approved for the program last year must be charged full lunch prices until their application is approved.** If you were approved for participation last year, you have until September 30 to submit a new form. In addition, if you so choose, the income information on your lunch application can be used to apply for waivers of student fees. Students who qualify for free/reduced lunches also qualify for student fee waivers under Nebraska law. Please contact your child's building principal for the form. A chart of the breakfast and lunch prices may be found elsewhere in this newsletter.

## KIDS CONNECTION

### HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM

Applications for Kids Connection, the state-sponsored children's health insurance program, will NOT be distributed through the schools this year. However, parents may obtain information through the toll-free number, 1-800-383-4278.

The Kids Connection health insurance program provides health care coverage to children of low income working families in Nebraska. Kids Connection is an expansion on the state's Medicaid program and provides health care coverage for children in families whose income is below the established threshold. Pregnant women with the same income level will also be included. The program is designed to provide routine, preventative health care and basic hospitalization for children needing coverage. Certain mental health services are included and pregnant women with the same income level are also included.

Good nutrition and good health have a definite impact on student learning. Please take advantage of Kids Connection and the free/reduced school lunch program if you qualify.

## SCHOOL TIME



School times this year will be the same as last; we are going to pick up right where we left off in May. For NBC, classes will start at 8:10 a.m. and end at 3:30 p.m. At North Bend Elementary, school will start at 8:10 a.m. and end at 3:25 p.m. with an early bell to dismiss bus students at 3:20 p.m.

**When necessary, early dismissal times will be 1:30 p.m. at both NBE and NBC. Late starts will be 10:30 a.m. at both schools.**

The times have been set to minimize traffic congestion at the two sites. Buses will load at NBE at 3:20 and we plan to have them out of the way by the time of regular elementary dismissal at 3:25. They arrive at the high school just before NBC students are dismissed at 3:30 p.m.

# Important Notices ! !

Listed on this page are brief summaries of notices to students, parents and community members. More detailed information can be found in the NBC and NBE Student Handbooks which are provided for each student, and in various informational items that are sent home from time to time. If you need information about any of the notifications below, please contact the office of the Superintendent at 652-3268.

**NON-DISCRIMINATION**--It is the policy of North Bend Central Public Schools not to discriminate on the basis of race, national origin, creed, age, marital status, sex, or disability in its educational programs, activities, or employment policies as required by Titles VI and VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, Title IX of the 1972 Education Amendments, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and the Nebraska Equal Educational Opportunity Act. In addition, the school district recognizes its responsibilities under Section 504 (Part D) of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 to identify, evaluate, and provide access to appropriate educational services for students with disabilities. The Superintendent of Schools is hereby designated as the coordinator of the district's efforts to comply with the policy statement above.

**STAFF QUALIFICATIONS**--The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 gives parents the right to get information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teachers. Upon request, North Bend Central Public Schools will give parents specific qualification information on its teachers. Currently, all NBCPS teachers meet the "highly qualified" standards NCLB. Further information can be found in the Student Handbooks.

**PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT AND STUDENT PRIVACY**--Both state and federal law requires schools to adopt a policy on parental involvement in school programs, selection of curriculum, testing procedures, etc. The NBCPS Board Policy on parental involvement states: "The North Bend Central Public Schools Board of Education encourages parent interest and involvement in the educational practices of the school district. This policy shall be reviewed annually following an opportunity for public comment. It is the policy of the school district to provide full access, during the regular office business hours, to the parent or legal guardian of any student of this district to review textbooks, tests, curriculum materials, records of a student of any such parent, unless otherwise prohibited by law, and to any surveys of students done by the school district."

Complaints or objections to any materials or procedures can be referred to the Superintendent. In addition, Parents are encouraged to visit school and to observe classroom procedure, activities, and the general atmosphere of the educational process. All visitors are to report to the school office prior to classroom visitations.

**CHILD FIND NOTICE** -- North Bend Central Public Schools requests your help in locating handicapped children. Schools implement the Federal Handicapped Children's Act which guarantees a free appropriate education program for all children between the ages of 0-21 years of age. If you have a student or know of a young person with special needs between 0-21 years of age that is not enrolled in an appropriate location program, please notify Dr. Dan Endorf, Supt., North Bend Central Public Schools, P.O. Box 160, North Bend, NE 68649 OR 402 652-3268.

**PRIVACY RIGHTS**--The Federal Rights and Privacy Act (FRPA) protects students and parents from the unauthorized release of information. North Bend Central Public Schools Board Policy 3140 and Administrative Regulation 3140AR provide detailed information on what can and cannot be released, including the use of student directory information on the school district's website. You can find this policy information in the Student Handbooks and on the website. Directory information may be released by the Administration. This information includes: student's name, parents' names, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, grade level, enrollment status, field of study, activity participation information, height and weight of athletes, dates of attendance, awards and honors, previous schools attended, electronic mail address and photograph. Release of other information shall require parental permission except that nothing in this policy shall prevent an activity sponsor from discussing a student's activity performance with news media representatives. Directory information that may not be used on the website without the specific, written permission of the eligible student or his/her parent or guardian includes: student's address, telephone listing, electronic mail address, and date/place of birth. A parent or eligible student has the right to refuse to let the District designate any or all of the types information listed above as directory information. The period of time within which a parent or eligible student has to notify the District in writing that he/she does not want any or all of those types of information about the student designated as directory information is two weeks from the time the notice is first published.

**RECRUITING INFORMATION**--The No Child Left Behind Act requires North Bend Central Public Schools to provide military recruiters and institutions of higher education access to secondary school students' names, addresses, and telephone listings. Parents and secondary students have the right to request that North Bend Central Public Schools not provide this information (i.e., not provide the student's name, address, and telephone listing) to military recruiters or institutions of higher education, without their prior written parental consent. North Bend Central Public Schools will comply with any such request.

**SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES** -- North Bend Central Public Schools can provide a broad range of services for students with special learning conditions. This includes pre-school children from birth on. Learning is too important for these services to be unused. If you feel that your child needs more learning assistance than he or she is getting, call us. A child's success in school is crucial and we need to use all of the resources at our command to achieve it. In addition, the school asks your help in finding children aged 0-21 who may be in need of special education services. These services are provided for children with the following handicaps: vision, hearing, physical development, emotional development, speech or language development and intellectual development. - \* Fill out the form provided and be sure you select North Bend Central
- \* Click on Create Account
- \* Add a student - click continue and fill out the form
- \* Your student will be displayed. Click add student. If you need to add another student - click add another student otherwise click finish
- \* Enter phone number to receive text alerts on your account (optional). Click on don't show message again
- \* It is important to add all your students.
- \* Some products are only available to certain students. (example: senior class dues)
- \* You will receive an email to validate your email address. Please check your email and follow the instructions. Once your email is validated, you are ready to use My School Bucks
- \* We are currently offering the following online payments: Family Lunch, After School Program, Preschool Tuition, Senior Class Dues, Activity Passes (student or adult) and the Elementary Yearbook.
- \* To purchase, choose which icon and click on it and view details
- \* Fill out the item form and add to the basket
- \* Continue shopping by filtering your items by school or category or click on home or school store menus on top of the page
- \* When finished go to the shopping cart and check out.
- \* The first time you check out, you will see your Membership Options Pay-As-You-Go (3.95% fee based on percentage of sales) or OnePay Membership for e-Checks. OnePay is an annual fee of \$12.95 for individual or \$26.95 for family. Once you sign up you can use the e-Checks for the 12 months with no additional payment fees.
- \* After selecting payment method, enter in the payment method details and place your order.
- \* An email confirmation will be sent to you with your order.
- \* You can look up your previous order and account history under your name on the top of the screen.
- \* My School Bucks can be used anywhere, anytime 24 hours a day and 7 days a week.
- \* If you have questions, please don't hesitate to contact the high school



### **Cell Phone Policy at NBC**

We all have them and feel lost if we forget them at home... Yes, our cell phones have now become part of us. We understand that cell phones are a vital part of communication between students and parents, but we also want to keep the classroom a learning environment for all students with little to no distraction. In short, the policy states that cell phones may be used by the students before/ after school and at lunch. Phones may not be used in the classroom, restroom or locker rooms. Students needing to check their phones during instructional time or during passing period should ask for permission from a teacher or come to the office.



### **Homework, Please**

When calling in your student absent to school, please notify the office if you would like us to collect homework for the day. Homework can be collected for pick-up or sent home with a sibling. If you don't request homework collection, homework will not be collected and the student can visit with his/her teachers on their return to get caught up in class.

### **Transportation to School Activities**

Students participating in school-sponsored activities must ride to and return from said activities in the transportation provided by the school. The only exception is when parent/guardian provide a written note (to the sponsor) for the student to not ride home on the school provided transportation with an adult (at least 21 years of age). Failure to do so will result in the student not attending the next out of town event scheduled for this activity.

### **North Bend Central Schools Damage/Loss Cooperative**

## Remember...Arrive Alive!

A reminder of when a person holding a School Permit may operate a motor vehicle:

Unsupervised to and from where student attends school over the most direct and accessible route by the nearest highway from his or her place of residence to transport oneself and any family member who lives with school permit driver to attend duly scheduled courses of instruction/ extracurricular/school-related activities at the school he or she attends; or Student driver may drive anytime when accompanied by a licensed driver who is at least 21 years old. Motorcyclists must be accompanied by a licensed motorcycle operator who is within visual contact and at least 21 years old.

By breaking these laws ,a student may have driving privileges suspended, until 18 years of age.
